We've been dreaming of summer all winter, but construction season is a nightmare that shortly follows. Peel has a number of major projects in the works to ensure regional roads stay maintained. Other initiatives include the widening of roads and expansion of bridges to accommodate annual growth

Gary Kocialek, Peel Transportation Director, said there is no silver bullet for eliminating disruption to road users. "We take steps to minimize those impacts by providing significant advance notice and by staging work to avoid lane closures where possible. Night work is not always an option when residential areas are factored in. 'One of Peel's highest priority projand widening of Mayfield, from Bramalea to Airport Roads, which is expected to commence in June and will take two years to complete. Widening roads alone will not solve our congestion problems. We need to use the infrastructure we have better More than 80 percent of cars on the road only have a single occupant. Carpooling, transit, walking, and cycling where possible are great ways to save on your transportation costs, help reduce congestion, and get active," said Kocialek.

The George Bolton Parkway, in Caledon, will be reconstructed from Hwy 50 to Nixon Road. It will include minor repairs to storm sewers, replacement of curbs, and road reconstruction. The road will be resurfaced to include bicycle lanes and a left turning lane. This road will be a fully urbanized industrial road that acts as a collector road between Coleraine Drive and Hwy 50. Temporary lane closures are expected, however, two-way traffic will be maintained.

The Province's Highway 401 expansion project includes adding HOV lanes. while widening the existing six lane configuration to 12 lanes from the Credit River to Winston Churchill Boule vard, 10 lanes from Winston Churchill Boulevard to Highway 407 ETR / Highway 401 interchange, 12 lanes from Highway 407 ETR/ Highway 401 interchange to James Snow Parkway, and 10 lanes from the James Snow Parkway to Region Road 25.
