2. Bill 59, which includes the Home Inspection Act, 2017 was passed in April 2017
3. The Ontario Association of Home Inspectors has been recreated within Bill 59 and will continue as The Ontario Association of Home Inspectors
4. Implementation will take time
5. OAHI members are regulated by the association
6. OAHI was created by Bill Pr158, the Ontario Association of Home Inspectors Act 1994
7. OAHI members operate under high levels of education and professionalism
8. OAHI is recognized by the Ontario Real Estate Association
9. For a home inspector to receive a business license in the City of Barrie, they must be a member of OAHI
10. OAHI members must update their education regularly
11. Practicing OAHI members must carry insurance
